September 2, 2014 Fire Commission Meeting Minutes

1. Approval of Agenda-Call to order 730 pm. Approval of Agenda.
 - **M/S. Rey/Marinoff to approve agenda. All in favor.**
2. Approval of July Minutes
 - Chief corrected two instances where he wrote June instead of July.
 - Commissioner Naylor thanked the Chief for research the details of an emergency incident he had questions on.
 - **M/S Albano/Marinoff to approve July minutes with changes. All In favor.**
3. July and August Activity Schedule and Response Report.
 - The July and August Activity Schedule was reviewed. There were no questions.
 - The July and August Response Report was reviewed. The Chief gave some details of the two strike team assignments the department participated in during July and August. He noted that while yes, overtime did happen during the assignments a majority of the costs would be reimbursed by the state. He said he is waiting for the state paperwork still. Commissioner Naylor asked what the turn around time was for reimbursement. Chief stated that typically is between six and twelve weeks. There were a number of questions on emergency incidents. Chief made notes and would have answers for the Commission at next meeting.
4. 2014/15 Fire Department Budget
 - The 2014/15 Fire Department Budget was reviewed as well as the final 2013/2014 year to date expenditures. The end of 2013/14 budget fund balance was increased \$104,448. Chief noted that this years fund balance restoration was budgeted to increase \$123,252 but that number would probably be higher since \$53,000 was budgeted for a fire engine lease payment and that the first payment won't be made until the following years budget. The District still has not meet the policy target of \$301,000 for capital, reserves, and unfunded liability.
5. Chief Report
 - Chief gave a status report on the recently signed Shared Services Agreement with San Rafael. Changes have been made in dispatch. Cross over training was completed with emphasis on engine familiarization and drive time, truck training, and SCBA training. Este Cespedes has passed his paramedic state exam and is awaiting his National Registry and State Certification license. Chief has a meeting next week with Chief Gray and Miles Julian from County EMS on what needs to be done to have Este be accredited in Marin under Paramedic Service Area B. When Este is ready San Rafael will provide Marinwood with the necessary ALS equipment.
 - Chief gave an update on the Firefighter and Firefighter Paramedic testing process. Both eligibility lists have been established. The firefighter list has 29 eligible candidates and the firefighter paramedic list has 10 eligible candidates.
 - Chief gave an update on the MERA Campaign he is working on. Priorities for the Committee are public outreach, endorsements, and financial donations. The Commission discussed the possibility of holding an educational outreach meeting in Marinwood. It

was agreed that it would be a good idea. Possible times were discussed and it was felt by most that mid week in the evening would be the best option.

- Chief gave an update on the lease contract and the engine purchase. He was close to having all the requirements met by the lender to have the lease funded. An example of some of the requirements are a certificate of insurance, the Surety Bond, a letter from counsel to name a few. Chief hopes to have lease funded and enter into contract with KME in the next two weeks.
- The Chief gave an update on a few of the vegetation management projects he is working on around the community.

The department responded to 99 emergency calls in September, a busy month for emergency responses. Most were medical in nature but the department did respond to two structure fires in Novato, one vegetation fire in Novato, two natural gas leaks in Novato, three cover in assignments in Novato, two structure fires in San Rafael, one vehicle fire in Marinwood, and one strike team assignment to Pollack Pines for the King Fire for eleven days.

COMMUNITY SERVICE/PREVENTION/ASSOCIATION MEETINGS

- I completed four inspections, all for final inspections of a new solar systems.
- One fire commission meeting was held in September.

- I had a meeting in September with North Bay Conservation Corps about possible vegetation management projects in LVEHOA. A copy of the project and the budget is included in the Commission Packet.
- The on duty engine company attended the Heatherstone Block Party in September.
- The department helped the Marin YMCA fill their swimming pool in September.
- I attended the MERA Governing Body Board Meeting during September.
- I also attended four MERA Campaign Committee meetings and continued to work on endorsements and fundraising.
- The type 3 along with two volunteers attended the Dixie Soccer Kick Off event at Miller Creek School in September.
- Volunteer Firefighter Appreciation Night was held during September at the pool. BBQ and innertube waterpolo were the main events.
- Volunteer Firefighter Open House was held during September for potential volunteers.
- Two meetings with Rotary Valley Senior Housing Disaster Preparedness Committee were held. Vegetation Management and the development of a vegetation management and maintenance plan are underway.
- A California Special Districts Association Risk Management inspection was done of all CSD buildings and facilities during July. We are awaiting the report.
- A MERA Education Presentation was held at Rotary Valley Senior Housing in September by Dave Jefferies, MERA Special Project Manager.
- A MERA Educational Meeting was held at the Marinwood Community Center by Dave Jefferies, MERA Special Project Manager.
- Sheriff's Office held a Drug Take Back Day. One of the Drop Off points was the Marinwood FD.

TRAINING

- Six minutes of Safety training was reviewed daily by on duty staff.
- Firefighter Este Cespedes passed the California Paramedic examination in July. I held a Meeting with Chief Gray and County EMS Director Miles Julian to see what needs to be done to have him certified in Marin County and within Paramedic Service Area B. See additional Chief Report for more information.
- Department Personnel continued with the Target Safety Training Program September.
- One paid employee continued working on Officer Training.
- All three shifts participated in a multi company drill/training through the Central Marin Training Consortium in September. Firefighter Safety and Survival was the topic.
- Four volunteer drills were held in September. Topics included wildland firefighting, firefighter interview process, firefighter safety and survival, and volunteer appreciation night.

MAINTENANCE

- All 4 department vehicles underwent a comprehensive monthly check during September.
- All gas-powered equipment was checked weekly during the month.
- All vehicle batteries were serviced and charged on a weekly basis during the month.
- All radio batteries were rotated and charged on a weekly basis during the month.
- Engine 658 had a preventative maintenance check done in September.
- The final details of the lease and payment for the new Type 1 were completed during September.
- Unit 58 had a preventative maintenance check done and new tires put on during September.

Shared Service Update

The Shared Services Agreement has been signed by both jurisdictions. Changes have been made in the CAD at dispatch to reflect a true boundary drop between the agencies. The changes have Marinwood responding east of the freeway again. I hope to meet with Chief Gray next week to review the hours Marinwood employees have worked in San Rafael and vice versa and see about reimbursement procedures.

Paramedic Update through Shared Services

Firefighter Este Cespedes has passed his state paramedic certification. He received his National Registry and his California State certification. Chief Gray is drafting a letter to Miles Julian stating Este Cespedes will be a Marinwood Paramedic working within Paramedic Service Area B under their medical direction. When the EMS office has that Este can take the in county Paramedic Protocol Test. Once that is passed, Este will work a few shifts as a third paramedic on the ambulance to refresh skills and gain experience. San Rafael is assembling ALS bags for Marinwood apparatus.

I am going to work with BC Jeff Rowan to come up with policies and procedures for narcotics log and how to secure narcotics.

Salary and benefits for the position need to be negotiated as well as an exit strategy for current Marinwood employees who wish to voluntarily move to a firefighter paramedic position.

Included in the Commission Packet is a DRAFT Firefighter Paramedic job description. I started with the Marinwood Firefighter job description then added some certs and quals as stated in Marinwood Paramedic Job Announcement for the last test and added a few things from San Rafael's Paramedic job description.

MERA Update

I continue to be a part of MERA's Campaign Committee. Meetings are monthly. Focus is on fundraising and educational outreach. I have attended a number of meetings with community groups and made presentations along with Dave Jefferies, MERA Special Projects Manager.

Fire Engine Purchase

The District has purchased a new engine from KME. CSA 13's cash payment was transferred to KME as well as the lease funded and that money also transferred to KME. The first lease payment will be in July 2015. Three personnel from Marinwood are flying to the KME factory in Pennsylvania in late October for a preconstruction meeting and to finalize the last details. This is fully covered by the KME and included in the cost of the fire engine.

Strike Team Assignments

The department has responded on three strike team assignments this summer. They are as follows-

7/5-9/2014 three personnel on Type 3 reassigned to Monticello incident

2. 8/1-8/2014 three personnel on Type 3 assigned to Log Fire near Yreka
8/8-16/2014 three personnel on Typ3 3 reassigned to Beaver Fire near Klamath
8/16/2014 released
3. 9/15-20/2014 four personnel on Type 3 assigned to King Fire near Placerville
9/20-25/2014 four personnel on Type 3 reassigned to different branch of King Fire
9/26/2014 released

I am waiting on the financial report from the state. When I get that I can let the commission know how much OT was spent on the strike team and providing coverage and how much will be reimbursed.

Vegetation Management Projects

There are a few vegetation management projects needed in the District. At the end of Valleystone there is a large pile of tree branches that has piled up that needs to be chipped. I am working with Rotary Valley to secure a grant through FireSafe Marin for a vegetation management and maintenance plan. And I have a meeting with North Bay Conservation Corps in early September about some work in Lucas Valley Estates.

FIREFIGHTER/PARAMEDIC

Firefighter/Paramedics are responsible for the protection of life and property through firefighting activities, emergency medical services, fire prevention and Community Fire Servicing. A major portion of their work involves participating in inspection activities, supervised drills and training, and routine maintenance of equipment, apparatus and stations. Work at incident scenes and the fire station is normally performed under the supervision of a fire captain.

Qualifications

- Minimum of 18 years of age.
- Proof of US Citizenship.

- Valid High School Diploma or GED
- Possession of valid State of California Driver's License
- Completion of a California State Board of Fire Service Firefighter I.
- Possession of a current EMT -1 Certificate (or EMT-Paramedic)
- Possession of a current AHA CPR for the Healthcare Provider Card
- Confined Space Rescue – Awareness (7 Hrs)
- Hazardous Materials First Responder – Operational (16 Hrs)
- ICS - 200 Basic Incident Command (SEMS Equivalent)
- FSTEP Auto Extrication (16 Hrs)
- CICC / NWCG S130 – Wildland Firefighter Type II
- CICC / NWCG S190 – Intro. To Wildland Fire Behavior
- CICC / NWCG S131 – Advanced Firefighter / Squad Boss
- National Registry Paramedic Certification
- California State Paramedic Certification (P Card)
- Must be able to become accredited with the Marin EMS Agency within 6 months of hire
- AHA Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS)

Desirable

- Minimum of One (1) year experience working as a Paramedic
- Either: Pre-hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) or International Trauma Life Support (ITLS)
- Either: Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) or Pediatric Education for Pre-hospital Providers (PEPP)

Examination

The evaluation for the position of firefighter consists of the following:

- Written examination
- Physical agility or Valid CPAT Card
- Oral interviews (Peer and Chief's Interviews)
- Paramedic Skills Assessment Center
- Background Investigation and Psychological evaluation
- Review of California Driving Record and LIVESCAN Application.
- Pre-employment medical exam and drug screening test

Interview

Applicants who have successfully completed the examination process will be placed on an "Eligibility List." The Department utilizes the firefighter paramedic eligibility list to schedule applicants for pre-employment interviews.

Note: Current Marinwood Volunteer Firefighters in good standing, with a minimum of 6 months in the department at the time of application will receive an additional 2.5 points applied to the Oral Interview test score.

Preparation

Applicants for the position of firefighter paramedic should be able to read and comprehend material encountered at grade level 14. In addition, beginning a regular physical conditioning program in advance greatly improves performance on the physical agility test.

Probationary Period

- One year with Six (6) month evaluations.
- Six month manipulative test
 - Twelve month final written exam, manipulative exam and evaluation
