September 5, 2017 Fire Commission Meeting Minutes

1. Approval of Agenda-Call to order 7:08 pm.
  - **M/S Curran/Marinoff to approve agenda as presented. All in favor.**
2. Public Comments on Non Agenda Items
  - Linda Barnello had comments questioning why so much money was being spent on Attorney Fees in the FLSA Lawsuit and that the District should settle the overtime lawsuit and pay the firefighters what they are owed. Ron MArnioff explained both sides had agreed to a settlement but that it must be approved by the judge.
  - Ron Marinoff spoke on the issues of confederate statues around the country. Linda Barnello said Ron should not be allowed to speak during public comment and said she would be filing a Brown Act violation.
3. Draft Minutes for the August Commission Meeting
  - **M/S Marinoff/Albano to approve the August Minutes. All in favor.**
4. Activity Summary and Response Report for August 2017.
  - The Activity Summary for August was reviewed. Chief commented that the State and Western US was in the middle of a very extreme wildland season.
  - The Response Report for August 2017 was reviewed. Chief mentioned the TYPE 3 was currently out at a fire in the Sequoia National Forest being cross staffed by a SR Captain, Marinwood Acting Engineer, and SR Firefighter. Neither agency could commit all the resources needed for the assignment so both contributed what they could to meet the assignment. Commissioner Marinoff commented that a large tree limb fell on Mt. McKinley and he called the department and they responded quickly to cut the limb up and remove it from the roadway.
5. Succession Planning for the Implementation of Paramedics and Hiring Options
  - The Fire Commission discussed the current staffing of the fire department and how many openings there currently are, how many openings there may be in the next few months, and when the next Joint New Hire Academy would be with San Rafael. The next joint new hire academy will be on 12/1/2017. Chief said the department will have if not two new paramedics in that academy. In the meantime Temporary Firefighter David Purcell has been hired to help fill the gap.
6. Chief Report
  - Chief gave an update on the Disaster Preparedness Trailer. Also, the Chief is working with CERT Leaders from Mont Marin, LVHA, and Marinwood to plan a coordinated disaster drill between all three CERT Areas.
  - Chief gave an update on preparations for Wildland Season.
  - Chief gave an update on the Queenstone Fire Road repair as well as vegetation management project along the fire road prior to the repairs. Hopefully both will occur between now and the end of the calendar year.

7. **Kitchen Remodel**

- Chief gave an update on the kitchen. The Board has decided to go through the RFP and accept sealed bids. This process will more than likely extend the timeline for the project and drive costs up. Chief is currently working with the architect to update the drawings and he is working on updating the RFP.

8. **Memorial Policy**

- The Fire Commission reviewed the Draft Memorial Policy that was completed by the P and R Commission. Chief explained that this came from the request by Jennie Bouldings children to place a memorial bench in front of the Community Center. The Board wanted a standard for the District created, hence the policy. DM Dreikosen also explained that any memorial for Fire Department personnel would be reviewed by the Fire Commission with the Board having the final decision.
- **M/S Marinoff/Albano All in favor of approving the draft Memorial Policy.**

9. **Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department**

- The Board of Directors appointed Members Naylor and Kliennman-Green to the committee to research what direction the Fire Department should go in upon the Chief's retirement. The Commission was asked to vote for how many members they felt should be on the committee and who from the Commission should serve.
- **M/S Marinoff/Albano To have two members from the Fire Commission on the ad hoc committee and that those two members be Greg Stilson and Dan Curran with Russ Albano available as alternate.**

William Kelly has been hired and will begin some in house training beginning December 1 and will start the new hire academy on January 2, 2018. He will be back on shift hopefully by March 1.*

### **EMERGENCY CALLS**

In October 2017 the department responded to 124 emergency calls that were mostly medical in nature. The department did respond to a car fire in Marinwood, two small grass fires in the new JPA area, two structure fires in San Rafael, one wildland fire in San Rafael, and two structure fires in Novato and two wildland fires in Novato. Initially when the fire siege struck Santa Rosa area our engine was dispatched to cover Novato, who sent engines to it and had their own fire near Sears Point. The Marinwood engine was one of two covering all of Novato, Marinwood, and Northern San Rafael, an area normally protected by 8 engines. They were busy responding to regular emergencies in the area. As Novato was able to back fill our type 3 engine went to the Lakeville fire and I was able to backfill with off duty personnel. Our type 3 was released after about 24 hours. A day later it was sent as part of a task force to protect City of Sonoma for a 24 hour period.

Needless to say there were a number of worried residents calling for information, calling in smoke checks, and since the fires have been extinguished calling about vegetation management. Many want the District to be responsible. One resident would like to organize a volunteer vegetation management crew to do projects in the Marinwood open space. I suggested he contact the Board first.

### **COMMUNITY SERVICE/PREVENTION/ASSOCIATION MEETINGS**

- I completed one final inspection of a new solar systems in Marinwood during October.
- Two final residential sprinkler inspections were completed in Marinwood in October and one rough in sprinkler inspection was completed in October.
- One Board Meeting was held in October.
- I continued working with the Lions Club and the CERT Steering Committee on CERT related issues in August. One CERT Steering committee meetings were held in October. Planning is underway for a coordinated drill between LVHA, Month Marin, and Marinwood Cert groups in October. *This drill was cancelled as it was in the middle of the fire siege plaguing NorCal. Was rescheduled for November 4.*
- I attended the MERA Governing Board and Executive Board meetings in October.
- I sent out information on a GET Ready Class in November during October. Over 70 people are registered.
- Two birthday tours were done at the firehouse during October.
- I did vegetation management inspections for homeowners on Johnstone Dr., Blackstone Lane, and Idylberry during October
- Two raffle winners received rides to and from School with the fire department.
- The on duty engine company did a pre school presentation to Bright Horizons Preschool in October.
- An Old Timers BBQ was held at the Community Center during October. Over 60 past members of the paid and volunteer ranks of the Marinwood FD attended.
- Volunteer FF Valerie Briones read books to the preschool at the community center during October.
- Volunteer FF Patrick Donovan took the type 3 to the St. Vincent's pumpkin patch on Saturday in October.

### **TRAINING**

- Six minutes of Safety training was reviewed daily by on duty staff.
- Department Personnel continued with the Target Safety Training Program during October.

- All three shifts went through two multi company drills in October through CMTC. The topic was class room and practical for Hazardous Materials Operations.
- Four Volunteer drills were held in October. Topics included firefighter safety and survival, HazMat Operations, and drivers training.
- Dan continues to work on his Probationary Training.
- Dan Rotwein and David Purcell are working on their in house engineer certification.
- The on duty engine company taught Jail Fire Procedures to the new Sheriff Academy at 1600 Los Gamos. The training included fire extinguisher use, SCBA's training, and fire stream application.

### **MAINTENANCE**

- All 4 department vehicles underwent a comprehensive monthly check during October.
- All gas-powered equipment was checked weekly during the month.
- All vehicle batteries were serviced and charged on a weekly basis during the month.
- The Tam Fire Crew completed a Vegetation Management project along Queenstone Fire Road during October.

### **BUILDING MAINTENANCE**

- Every day daily maintenance is performed at the firehouse including but limited to-
  - Clear and disinfect all tables, counter tops, desks in the captains office, communications room, chief's office, day room, kitchen, and bathrooms.
  - Empty all trash cans and replace liners
  - Sweep and mop concrete floors in entire firehouse.
  - Clean all dishes, pots and pans, and store.
  - Wipe up any and all fluids from vehicles in apparatus room.
  - Sweep and mop apparatus room floor.
  - Disinfect and wash all of the bathrooms.
- Also, Maintenance is done on a weekly basis-
  - Monday Dust all window ledges, drapes, and blinds
  - Tuesday Clean all windows and doors inside and out.
  - Wednesday-Clean fridge and stove and microwave
  - Thursday-Mow lawn and sweep and blow all outside areas of firehouse, front and back.
  - Friday-Recyclables outside, clean and disinfect showers.
  - Saturday-Check all generators-including emergency generator), pumps, blowers, saws. Drain air compressor. Last Saturday of month hook up emergency power and make sure it works.
  - Sunday-Battery checks for suction units, cell phones, defibrillation units, and portable radios.

**Succession Planning for implementation of Paramedic Positions**

I have offered a job to William Kelly to replace Joel White's vacancy. William is a paramedic for the Stinson Beach Seasonal Ambulance, works for AMR in San Francisco, and has been a long time volunteer Firefighter with Stinson Beach and a long time Seasonal Firefighter with MCFD. William is married and has young twins and lives in Stinson Beach. The new hire academy begins in January. The department will have three paramedics, one on each shift when William completes the academy.

Additionally, the department is holding another Captain's promotional process at the end of this year and early next year to fill in for Captain Heine's absence. There is one opening and one qualified certified applicant, Otis Smith. The written test is November 20.

Captain Heine remains out injured. Temporary Firefighter David Purcell is just about out of hours. Currently there is not someone ready from the volunteer ranks to fill in as a temp.

**Cert**

I am currently working with CERT Leaders from Mont Marin, LVHA, and Marinwood for a joint drill. It was scheduled for October 14 but that was in the middle of the North Bay Fires so it was cancelled. It has been rescheduled for November 4. Multiple planning meetings have occurred in preparation for the drill.

**Vegetation Management Projects and Wildland Season**

The Marin County FD Fuels Crew completed a vegetation management project along Queenstone fire road in preparation for the regrading of the road which will hopefully happen late November. I have had a number of calls from residents concerned about wildland fire safety. I have also done four vegetation management inspections and given residents suggestions on how to maintain their property and the adjacent open space. Many of the residents who have called have asked if the CSD or the fire department will be doing the work on the open space near their home. I explain that is their responsibility, that the CSD has never done the maintenance but always allowed residents to go on the property to the work. This has not always been well received. Additionally, I was approached by a resident who wanted to organize a citizen volunteer crew to do vegetation management throughout the Marinwood open space. I suggested he approach the Board with this concept first.

### **Kitchen Remodel**

I have secured the permits from the Marin County Community Development. It wasn't a simple process, but a plan checker named Nicole was tremendously helpful in getting this done. Also, Eric, Irv, and I met with CWS Construction-the low bidder-to see if there was some cost saving option available in his bid. He made a few suggestions, none of which were good.

I would like to propose that the budget be adjusted to pay for the full \$87,000 bid CWS submitted. Money from the new Utility Pick Up truck could be reallocated to pay for the balance of the kitchen. This more than covers the cost and that the Commission recommends the Board authorize the Chief to enter into a contract with CWS for the kitchen remodel. It's been 8 months. If the above mentioned happens the kitchen project gets done in three weeks and we can all move on.

Additionally, another Cal Osha complaint was sent to the District regarding the kitchen.

### **Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department**

The Succession Planning Committee had it's first meeting on October 3. It will meet again before the Fire Commission meets on Nov 7.

### **DMV Use Fee for KME E-58**

WestAmerica Bank called me two weeks ago and discovered during the course of their audit they did not have a title for Engine 58. They asked if I had it and I did not. Cesar called KME and asked if they had the title and they said they had not. He asked if they had done the California vehicle registration paperwork and they had not. We had assumed this was done by the builder as it was when we purchased E-658 from Westmark or like when you purchase a new car. Apparently the California DMV Paperwork had never been completed and submitted to DMV. So I got started. In my first visit DMV gave me all the necessary paperwork which included an inspection by California Highway Patrol and that we owed \$62,000 in sales tax, penalties, and DMV Fees. I left concerned. Luckily we had proof of paying the sales tax so when I returned with all the completed paperwork including the inspection form, proof of sales tax payment and I explained the cause of the delay in registration they waived the \$5500 penalty fees. That left the one time payment of the DMV Use fees which amounts to \$5300. This is an unbudgeted item that will need special approval by the Board. I recommend the Commission make a motion the Board approve payment and register the fire engine.
