April 5, 2018 Fire Commission Meeting Minutes

1. Approval of Agenda-Call to order 7:00 pm.
 - **M/S Marinoff/Curran to approve agenda as presented. All in favor.**
2. Public Comments on Non Agenda Items
 - Linda Barnello commented that the ESS Committee seemed to be moving very slowly and she was wondering if the Fire Commission could do anything about that or the fact the paramedic position still hadn't been negotiated. Ron Marinoff commented that he attended the Sheriff Deputy's funeral service at the Civic Center and it was a very moving service.
3. Draft Minutes for the March Commission Meeting
 - **M/S Curran/Albano to approve the February minutes. All in favor.**
4. Activity Summary and Response Report for March 2018 were reviewed.
 - The Activity Summary for March 2018 was reviewed. There were no questions.
 - The response report for March 2018 was reviewed. Commissioner Albano had a question on a back pain incident.
5. Kitchen Contract
 - The Contract from Pope Construction was reviewed. Ron Marinoff mentioned that CSA 13 will actually be paying 25% of the total cost of the kitchen. **M/S Albano/Marinoff To recommend to the Board to Approve the contract and appliance purchases, for the last time. The Commission said they will not address the kitchen project again. All in favor.**
6. Succession Planning for the Implementation of Paramedics and Hiring Options
 - Chief commented that one of the Paramedics will be taking a job with SRFD and that he is interviewing some volunteers to hire as a temporary FF until a certified qualified paramedic can be hired.
7. Chief Report
 - Chief gave an update on the CERT Committee's work and explained their focus to the community will be on personal preparedness and vegetation management.
 - Chief gave an update on some new more aggressive and easier vegetation management guidelines and a draft policy. He needs to do some additional research and massaging of the guidelines and policy before it comes to the Board for approval.
 - Commissioner Farac presented an idea of having dumpster days where the department would provide dumpsters for residents to vegetation removal on their property of neighboring open space to help encourage residents to do the work and make the vegetation management budget have a larger impact to more community members. Chief explained that there is a "Chipper Program" in place through Fire Safe Marin very much like this. Chief and Steve will work on having a few Chipper days this spring.
 - Chief gave an update on the status of Utility 58 and that it had to be taken out of service for any off road responses due to it's age and some performance issues. There is \$35,000

in the budget for the Utility to be replaced. Three different quotes were reviewed by the Commission.

8. Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department

- There was a little discussion about the succession planning committee. Chief explained that initial meetings with Novato FPD, Marin County Fire Department, and San Rafael FD had occurred. Novato and Marin County were not interested in pursuing some sort of a merger at this time, but San Rafael did express interest. District Manager Dreikosen and Chief Roach met with City Manager Jim Shutz and Chief Gray to discuss the relationship. SR is interested in providing Chief Officer oversight for the Marinwood FD. The Fire Commission and the Fire Chief both feel the Board should reach out to SR and ask for that proposal.

COMMUNITY SERVICE/PREVENTION/ASSOCIATION MEETINGS

- I completed two final inspections of a new solar system in Marinwood during May.
- One Board Meeting was held during May.

- One volunteer and I made a fire safety presentation to the preschool class at the community center.
- The Burn relay was held in May. Lunch was had at the Marinwood Park for the relay.
- Two Rides to School were held in May. They are fundraisers for various schools.
- Five vegetation management inspections were held in May.
- Three Old Dixie Schoolhouse tours were held by me in May.
- I continued working with the Lions Club and the CERT Steering Committee on CERT related issues in May. One CERT Steering Committee meeting was held in May.
- I attended the MERA Governing Board meeting in May.
- I continued working with Kelby Jones of CSA 13 to make their community a Firewise Site. The Firewise Application was completed in and submitted in April.
- I met with a MERA Hardware Representative to review the department's base station hardware.
- One Old Dixie Schoolhouse Board meeting was held in May.
- One Dixie Foundation Board meeting was held in May. I am now on that Board that helps manage a four million dollar invest portfolio used for capital purchases in the Dixie School District

TRAINING

- Six minutes of Safety training was reviewed daily by on duty staff.
- Department Personnel continued with the Target Safety Training Program during May. Emphasis is on EMT Recertification and EMT Skill review.
- All three shifts went through two multi company drills in May through CMTC. Auto extrication and wildland fire operations were the topics.
- Four Volunteer drills were held in May. Topics included EMT recert, CPR recert, auto extrication, and wildland fire operations.
- William Kelly is going through the Joint New Hire Academy currently. It is 5 weeks long.

MAINTENANCE

- All 4 department vehicles underwent a comprehensive monthly check during March.
- All gas-powered equipment was checked weekly during the month.
- All vehicle batteries were serviced and charged on a weekly basis during the month.
- All battery powered medical equipment was charged and serviced weekly.
- The Type 3 went in to High Tech to have some prevenative maintenance done and some minor fixes completed in preparation of wildland season.
- A meeting was held with two County Fire reps, a private contractor and myself in May to plan the Queenstone Fire Road repair project.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE

- Every day daily maintenance is performed at the firehouse including but limited to-
 - Clear and disinfect all tables, counter tops, desks in the Captains office, communications room, chief's office, day room, kitchen, and bathrooms.
 - Empty all trash cans and replace liners
 - Sweep and mop concrete floors in entire firehouse.
 - Clean all dishes, pots and pans, and store.
 - Wipe up any and all fluids from vehicles in apparatus room.
 - Sweep and mop apparatus room floor.
 - Disinfect and wash all of the bathrooms.
- Also, Maintenance is done on a weekly basis-
 - Monday-Dust all window ledges, drapes, and blinds
 - Tuesday-Clean all windows and doors inside and out.
 - Wednesday-Clean fridge and stove and microwave
 - Thursday-Mow lawn and sweep and blow all outside areas of firehouse, front and back.
 - Friday-Recyclables outside, clean and disinfect showers.
 - Saturday-Check all generators-including emergency generator, pumps, blowers, saws. Drain air compressor. Last Saturday of the month hook up emergency power and make sure it works.
 - Sunday-Battery checks for suction units, cell phones, defibrillation units, and portable radios.

Succession Planning for implementation of Paramedic Positions

Wills is going through the New Hire Academy from May 1 through June 8. I have hired a temp firefighter to fill Dan's position for up to 1000 hours. Wills vacancy while he is in the academy will be filled with overtime. I am also putting together a new paramedic list to hire a full time paramedic firefighter to replace Dan.

Cert

The CERT Steering Committee continues to meet monthly and is working on ways to get more community participation. The priorities for the Committee this year is public education on personal disaster preparedness and wildfire protection and vegetation management. There is a June 7 meeting in the classroom of all Marinwood Cert graduates.

Vegetation Management Projects and Wildland Season

I am working with Kelby Jones in CSA 13 to make their community a Firewise Community Site. The initial Risk Assessment and application have both been completed and submitted to Firewise for consideration. These communities are much more fire safe and are eligible for many additional grants for fire prevention and wildland fire mitigation projects.

I have also had a meeting and site visit with MCFD Personnel and a private contractor to get the Queenstone Fire Road regraded. Gathering some additional info to know what the total cost will be. Hope to complete this project by mid July.

Kitchen Remodel

Appliances ordered and paid for. All have arrived and are the fire house. Specs for all have been provided to Pope Construction and the cabinet maker. Cabinets have been measured and ordered. Can be up to 10 weeks for those to be completed, hopefully it will be sooner.

Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department

Waiting for a proposal from San Rafael for Chief Officer oversight and to hear back from PERS.

New Utility Pick Up Truck Update and Shed purchase

The Board voted down the purchase of a new utility pick up truck. Their thought is it is an expensive purchase the District shouldn't make at this time due to the uncertainty of what direction the department may go AND the Board wants to make sure it is adequately planning and preparing for the increases in PERS and other OPEB costs.

There is an old shed in the back of the firehouse. It's falling apart and the equipment inside is being exposed to weather and other elements because of it. There is \$3,000 in the budget for a new shed. I think it would be a worthwhile purchase at this time.
