Parks and Recreation Report April 2019

Recreation

Pool & Aquatics

The pool opened for the 2019 season on Monday, April 1st. Current programming includes adult lap swim, recreation swim, tot pool, Waterdevils swim team, water polo, lifeguard training classes, and swim lessons. Most of our longtime "regulars" turned out for opening day, undeterred by the cold and wet weather. It has been fun catching up with both the returning lifeguard staff and the lap swimmers after the off-season.

Summer Camp Registration

Registrations continue to pour in for summer camps, swim lessons, pool parties, and picnic rentals. Most of our K-5th grade summer day camps are full with waitlists for all 10 weeks. Staff is continuing to promote the oldest and youngest age camps, all of which are filling more quickly than in previous years. We are pleased with enrollment thus far.

Special Events

Our Spring Art Show took place on Saturday, March 23rd and proved to be a popular event with our biggest crowd yet. This year's installment featured local artists with pieces incorporating elements of "Everyday Objects," this show's theme. Susan Press did another terrific job curating and organizing the show. We are grateful to her for once again bringing Marin's diverse and talented art community to Marinwood.

Wine & Canvas night took place on Friday, April 5th. The event well and participants seemed pleased with the instruction as well as with their paintings.

The Las Gallinas Lions Club will be hosting the 40th Annual Egg Hunt in Marinwood Park on Saturday, April 20th. The event will start at 10am sharp and will feature food and drinks by Johnny Doughnuts food truck.

Youth Activities

We offered a Spring Break Camp April 8th-12th for children ages 3-12. Throughout the week campers enjoyed making arts and crafts, playing games in the forest, swimming at the pool, and many other fun activities. Our spring break camp staff, most of whom were high school students also on spring break, came each day full of energy and creativity. The week went very well.

Parks/Maintenance

Winter Storms

On April 16th Roy's Sewer Service came out and scoped and took video footage of the drainage pipe located beneath the sinkhole in the panhandle. The footage revealed that the bottom of the pipe is completely rotted out, confirming our hypothesis that soil is being leached into the pipe during heavy water flow, which caused the sinkholes. Staff is currently evaluating how best to proceed with repairing the compromised pipe and filling the sinkholes.

Projects

In March staff worked with the fire department to complete a substantial repair of the fence behind the firehouse. The crew also updated the landscaping at the pool, completed some plumbing repairs in both the community center and pool building, upgraded the electrical outlets and lighting around the pool, and began making repairs to the waterslide.

Staff has begun annual turf maintenance in the 3 parks and pool, beginning with some irrigation repairs. Other

upcoming projects include additional fencing around the perimeter of the main park, new landscaping at the entrance to the community center, and repairs to the community center patios.

Contractors

Landesign has been pruning, weeding, blowing medians on Lucas Valley Road, weeding along Creekside, and blowing walkways throughout the CSD. Smith's Gopher and Trapping, in addition to checking for gopher and mole activity, has been addressing new vole activity in main park and pool area
