August 7, 2018 Fire Commission Meeting Minutes

1. Approval of Agenda-Call to order 7:05 pm.
  - **M/S Marinoff/Curran to approve agenda as presented. All in favor.**
2. Public Comments on Non Agenda Items
  - Linda Barnello commented on Measure Parcel Tax County wide and what it could be used for. She mentioned that many agencies around the County use some of the money to mitigate fire hazards, as allowed by the tax. She feels that Marinwood should explore that as a possible use for Measure A Funds. She also gave a detailed history of what Marinwood has spent in Measure A money and what they have left and will receive into the future.
3. Draft Minutes for the June Commission Meeting
  - **M/S Marinoff/Elsbree to approve the June minutes. All in favor with Curran abstaining because he was absent that meeting.**
4. Activity Summary and Response Report for July 2018 were reviewed.
  - The Activity Summary for July 2018 was reviewed. Chief commented that it was a busy month with the number of emergency responses and preparing for Wildland Season and that the Department responded to a ten day strike team assignment in early July. Board Member Shea asked about the distribution of calls and if the number of calls into San Rafael was increasing. Chief commented that no, the call distribution, while it fluctuates slightly month to month is typically the same.
  - The response report for July 2018 was reviewed. There were a handful of questions as to call types and locations.
5. Kitchen Status
  - Chief said cabinets and counter tops were all installed. Some electrical and plumbing work was being completed this week and appliances and tiles would go in late this week. Kitchen should be done Monday August 13.
6. Succession Planning for the Implementation of Paramedics and Hiring Options
  - Chief commented he has hired Volunteer Brad Davenport as a Temporary Firefighter to fill Dan Rotwein's vacancy. Wills is working as tailboard firefighter on B shift. Chief will hire one additional firefighter (paramedic) before he retires.
7. Chief Report
  - Chief gave an update on the CERT Committee's work and explained their focus to the community will be on personal preparedness and vegetation management. The Cert Steering Committee is planning a large Community Meeting on November 7 in the evening to include a representative from the Sheriff's Office, Chief Gray, members of San Rafael's vegetation management team, and the County wide Cert Coordinator.
  - Chief gave an update on the Firewise Application he worked on with Kelby Jones and CSA 13 and on the Queenstone Fire Road Project. Also there are two other pending

vegetation management projects, one at the end of Valleystone and one on a large median strip on Mt. Lassen.

**8. Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department**

- The Chief gave a brief report on the status of San Rafael's proposal and that it should work well for the Community when he retires. There are still a few details to work out, but he remains optimistic.

**9. Commission Members Item's of Interest**

- It was discussed that this should be moved to Agenda Item #2 in future agenda's.

- Use of Measure A Funds for Vegetation Management
- Future Hiring's

Relief Firefighter Position-Vacant

Note- I have hired a temporary FF, Brad Davenport, from the Volunteer Program to fill the position until a full time paramedic can be hired.

**VOLUNTEER STAFFING**

17 Current Volunteers including:

1 Volunteer Battalion Chief

1 Volunteer Firefighter/AO’s

7 Volunteer Firefighters qualified as “responders” (includes AO’s & BC)

**EMERGENCY CALLS**

In August 2018 the department responded to 107 emergency calls that were mostly medical in nature. The department did respond to one structure fire in San Rafael and one grass fire in Novato. Also, Wills Kelly responded with three San Rafael Firefighter’s on San Rafael’s OES engine to the Redding fire for fourteen days.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE/PREVENTION/ASSOCIATION MEETINGS**

- I completed three final inspections of a new solar system in Marinwood during August.
- One Board Meeting was held during August.
- One Fire Commission meeting was held in August
- Nine vegetation management inspections were held in August.

- One Old Dixie Schoolhouse tour was held by me in August and the website was updated.
- I continued working with the Lions Club and the CERT Steering Committee on CERT related issues in July. One CERT Steering Committee meeting was held in July. Planning is underway for a large Community Meeting held in November.
- I continued working with Kelby Jones of CSA 13 to make their community a Firewise Site. The Community was named a Firewise Sight in July.
- I attended the MERA Governing Board Meeting in August.
- One Birthday Tour was done at the Firehouse by on duty staff.
- I met with Kelby Jones, Tad from Treemasters, and Samantha from Open Space District to plan and organize a joint vegetation management project on the Mt. Lassen median area. The project was completed in August.
- A chipper day in CSA 13 was held in August. Over 50 homes participated.

### **TRAINING**

- Six minutes of Safety training was reviewed daily by on duty staff.
- All three shifts went through two multi company drills in August through CMTC and on line training through Target Solutions. Active Shooter classroom and hands on scenario's at IVC were the topics.
- Four Volunteer drills were held in August. Topics included wildland fire operations and Active Shooter scenarios.
- One of our volunteers planned a helicopter training with Reach Air Ambulance that was attended by Marinwood paid and volunteers and three other engines from around the County.
- William Kelly began working on his Engineer certification training.

### **MAINTENANCE**

- All 4 department vehicles underwent a comprehensive monthly check during August.
- All gas-powered equipment was checked weekly during the month.
- All vehicle batteries were serviced and charged on a weekly basis during the month.
- Two front windows in the Captain's Office were replaced due to cracking and breaking in them.
- The kitchen is 90% completed. Some painting and sheet rock work needs to be finished.
- Mt. Lassen Median vegetation management project was completed. A chipper day was held in CSA 13.
- A vegetation management project at the end of Valleystone is scheduled in September as well as a chipper day in Marinwood.

## **BUILDING MAINTENANCE**

- Every day daily maintenance is performed at the firehouse including but limited to-
  - Clear and disinfect all tables, counter tops, desks in the Captains office, communications room, chief's office, day room, kitchen, and bathrooms.
  - Empty all trash cans and replace liners
  - Sweep and mop concrete floors in entire firehouse.
  - Clean all dishes, pots and pans, and store.
  - Wipe up any and all fluids from vehicles in apparatus room.
  - Sweep and mop apparatus room floor.
  - Disinfect and wash all of the bathrooms.
- Also, Maintenance is done on a weekly basis-
  - Monday-Dust all window ledges, drapes, and blinds
  - Tuesday-Clean all windows and doors inside and out.
  - Wednesday-Clean fridge and stove and microwave
  - Thursday-Mow lawn and sweep and blow all outside areas of firehouse, front and back.
  - Friday-Recyclables outside, clean and disinfect showers.
  - Saturday-Check all generators-including emergency generator, pumps, blowers, saws. Drain air compressor. Last Saturday of the month hook up emergency power and make sure it works.
  - Sunday-Battery checks for suction units, cell phones, defibrillation units, and portable radios.

**Kitchen Status**

The kitchen is 90% completed. The wall between the kitchen and tv room needs to be sheet rocked and finished. The cover between the top of the cabinets and the ceiling needs to be installed. And some painting needs to be done.

**Shared Services Discussion**

Director Schwartz wanted the Commission to discuss the equitability of the current shared services agreement. Director Schwartz wanted the Commission to discuss the equitability of the current shared services agreement. This exercise has happened multiple times within the CSD and ultimately gets to no resolve. I have included a document that notes most of what each agency does for each other. I know that San Rafael provides Marinwood services that simply cannot be replaced and that by having the relationship with San Rafael our residents are better served.

**Parking on the Firehouse Driveway**

Director Schwartz wanted the Commission to discuss parking in front of the firehouse on the firehouse driveway. This is not an issue. Occasionally department employees park there if they are dropping off or picking up turnout equipment, or if there is no room to park on the street. Additionally, family members may park there when visiting the firehouse. Also, construction workers or maintenance workers may park there when doing work at the firehouse or the community center. This is not an issue and needs no further discussion.

**Succession Planning for implementation of Paramedic Positions and Chief Officer Services**

The Department currently has two openings, one for a FF/PM on shift and one for the Relief Firefighter position. The vacant FF/PM position is being filled by Temporary Volunteer FF Brad Davenport. I will be hiring a fulltime FF/PM in the next month or so. The Relief Firefighter position will remain vacant for the time being. I would like to promote a volunteer firefighter that meets the current firefighter job description and is in paramedic school with his completion of paramedic school a condition of employment.

The Board of Directors will consider the San Rafael proposal for Chief Officer Services at the September Board Meeting.

**Vegetation Management Projects and Wildland Season**

CSA 13 has been named a Firewise Community Site. This means the Community will collectively be making ongoing Wildfire Hazard Assessments and ongoing Fuel Reduction Projects. It also makes Wildfire Reduction Grant Awards more of a possibility.

The Queenstone Fire Road Project was completed in June and July. Additional work may need to be done after next winter depending on how the road holds up. The Queenstone Fire Gate was also repaired in July.

The Mt Lassen median fuel reduction projects was completed in August.

A two day chipper day was held in CSA 13 during August. Over 100 tons of flammable vegetation was removed.

A chipper day is scheduled in Marinwood for September 10.

A fuel reduction and firebreak project is scheduled at the end of Valleystone at the end of September.

Linda Barnello asked that the Fire Commission discuss the use of Measure A funds toward vegetation management projects. I believe this allowed and other jurisdictions do use some of the funds that way. Unfortunately in Marinwood I believe the Measure A funds have already been committed to other budget items for the next two years.



## Value benefit analysis for current Shared Services Agreement

- 9-1-1 service, support, monitoring, call handling, dispatch, coverage, maintenance, and oversight. City manages and currently pays for contract dispatch service with Marin County for Marinwood. Dispatch value approximately \$50,000 annual
- Fuel for District Fire Apparatus (two engines and utility vehicle). Value approximately \$15,000 annual
- Records management, phone, computer, radio, oxygen, Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) and equipment support. Software license value \$2000 annual. Computer value approximately \$1000 + IT support costs. Oxygen value is nominal however oxygen refill equipment is valued at over \$100K
- Incident Command Services: Value approximately \$60,000 (based on similar agreement between SR and Larkspur)
- Paramedic incentive for personnel. Value approximately \$11,000 annual per paramedic up to 3 paramedics approximately (\$33,000). Also includes paramedic oversight as paramedic authority.  
*Note: yet to be realized until there is agreement with labor to implement paramedics.*
- Paramedic equipment and supplies. Value approximately \$5,000 for initial complement. Includes all replacement supplies as needed, approximate value unknown. Full set-up for both engines. Total value approximately \$10,000 plus replacement supplies (\$2500-\$3500 annual?)  
*Note: yet to be realized until there is agreement with labor to implement paramedics.*

## Fire House Driveway Parking

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Eric and Tom

Since last night, I have researched the issue of parking in the fire house driveway.

I found two sections in the California Vehicle Code pertaining to fire station driveways, but they deal with the public street in front of a fire station. Section 22104 prohibits making a U-turn in front of a driveway entrance to a fire station and section 22500 (d) prohibits stopping or parking within 15 feet of a driveway entrance to a fire station.

Marinwood Ordinance 2011-3 regulates the use of vehicles within the District's parks and open space, not the fire house driveway. I found nothing more but maybe you know of something that I missed.

I also remember a "No Parking at Any Time" sign that was located between the two rollup doors for many years. On my way to the market Saturday afternoon, I checked and there is currently no sign. On my way back from the market about 5:00 pm I observed two airport shuttle vans parked side by side in the fire house driveway, completely blocking the driveway. I believe something need occur to eliminate this hazardous condition.

I suggest that the Fire Commission consider, at its next meeting, recommending to the Board, an Ordinance or at least a policy dealing with parking in the fire house driveway aside from fire and other visibly marked emergency vehicles. I also request that signage be considered by the Commission and recommended to the Board as well.
