August 1, 2017 Fire Commission Meeting Minutes

1. Approval of Agenda-Call to order 7:03 pm.
 - **M/S Marinoff/Elsbree to approve agenda as presented. All in favor.**
2. Public Comments on Non Agenda Items
 - **No one from the public was present**
3. Draft Minutes for the May Commission Meeting
 - **M/S Marinoff/Curran to approve the May Minutes. Board Member Jeff Naylor had a question on if Chief followed up on a question Commissioner Albano had in the May Response Report. Chief commented he thought he had.**
4. Activity Summary and Response Report for June and July 2017.
 - The Activity Summary for June and July was reviewed. Chief commented that both months were fairly busy preparing for Wildland Season and that Wildland Season is upon us.
 - The Response Report for June and July 2017 was reviewed. Chief mentioned that for both months the department responded to 100 emergency incidents each month. Board Member Jeff Naylor had a question about the response locations, it seemed as if the OLD JPA and the New JPA response numbers were reversed. Chief commented he was correct and would make the switch. Commissioner Marnioff thought the fire alarm responses seemed high and questioned if they were for the same address. Chief said they were not, and that for a two month response number they were about average.
5. Succession Planning for the Implementation of Paramedics and Hiring Options
 - The Fire Commission discussed the current staffing of the fire department and how many openings there currently are, how many openings there may be in the next few months, and when the next Joint New Hire Academy would be with San Rafael. They also discussed three different hiring options to consider. All are outlined in the Chief Report. After much discussion and listening to the Chief's recommendation to go with Hiring Option C, the Fire Commission unanimously recommended the same, going with hiring option C. **M/S Marinoff/Albano To recommend to the Board the Chief pursue hiring Option C when it comes time to hire again.**
6. Chief Report
 - Chief gave an update on the Disaster Preparedness Trailer. It has been completely outfitted and map books prepared. Chief and the On Duty Engine Company got the trailer to a CERT AREA Block Party recently and the engine company attended and spoke on behalf of the department.
 - Chief gave an update on preparations for Wildland Season. All hose will be tested in May and June, wildland packs placed in service, and wildland training emphasized. Wildland Season is upon us.
 - Chief gave an update on two vegetation management projects he is working on. One here in Marinwood with CCNB doing the work and one in CSA 13 that Kelby Jones (CSA 13 Disaster Prep Coordinator) is organizing.

7. Kitchen Remodel

- Chief met again with John Pope Construction and he is preparing a new bid for the kitchen remodel that will fall within the District budget. He explained that SB 854 is not as restrictive as we were interpreting it. That through sub-contracting there will be considerable savings. He is a DIR Registered contractor and has worked on many public works projects in the past. I am awaiting his proposal.

8. Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department

- Chief discussed that it would be a good time to start exploring possible options for the District to consider when he decides to retire. Chief recommended establishing a sub committee to explore the different options available to the District, what those options would cost, how they might affect service levels, and how they might affect other stakeholders. The first step would be establish who would actually be on the committee then to figure out what the committee would do. **M/S Marinoff/Albano To establish an ad hoc committee to study the future of the Marinwood FD. All in favor.**

“C” shift- *Captain Steve Heine*, Acting Captain/Engineer John Papanikolaou, Acting Engineer/Firefighter Sean Day, Temporary Firefighter David Purcell

Relief Firefighter Position-Vacant

One Fire Captain off on industrial disability leave. I have hired David Purcell, a volunteer Firefighter who meets the Firefighter requirements as a temporary firefighter beginning in June. Shifts were rebid after the Engineer promotion. Above shifts reflect the new line up. I have a current firefighter paramedic list and will hire at least one, possibly two depending on Captain Heine’s status when the next new hire academy occurs. This could be September or October, exact dates TBD.

VOLUNTEER STAFFING

20 Current Volunteers including:

One Volunteer Battalion Chief

1 Volunteer Firefighter/AO’s

7 Volunteer Firefighters qualified as “responders” (includes AO’s & BC)

13 Volunteer Firefighter qualified as a “non responder”

A volunteer Engineer Academy is being put on by newly promoted Engineer Jeff Smith. There are 5 volunteers in the program.

EMERGENCY CALLS

In August 2017 the department responded to 105 emergency calls that were mostly medical in nature. The department did respond to a couple of small vegetation fires in Marinwood as well as one strike team assignment to a large fire in Sequoia National Forest.

COMMUNITY SERVICE/PREVENTION/ASSOCIATION MEETINGS

- I completed two final inspections of new solar systems in Marinwood during August.

- Two final residential sprinkler inspections were completed in Marinwood in August and one rough in sprinkler inspection was completed in August.
- Two Board Meetings were held in August.
- I continued working with the Lions Club and the CERT Steering Committee on CERT related issues in August. One CERT Steering committee meetings were held in August. Planning is underway for a coordinated drill between LVHA, Month Marin, and Marinwood Cert groups in October.
- I attended the MERA Governing Board and Executive Board meetings in August.
- I sent out information on a GET Ready Class in November during August.
- Two camp tours were done at the firehouse during August.
- The on duty engine company attended the National Night Out Event at the LVCC during August.
- I did a vegetation Management inspection for a homeowner on Johnstone Dr.
- I renewed the Districts Federal System Awards Management (SAM) Registration during August. This allows the District to receive federal grant funds and be reimbursed for any Federal Strike Teams the department participates in.

TRAINING

- Six minutes of Safety training was reviewed daily by on duty staff.
- Department Personnel continued with the Target Safety Training Program during August
- All three shifts went through two multi company drills in August through CMTC. The topic was class room and practical for Firefighter Safety and Survival.
- Four Volunteer drills were held in August. Topics included firefighter safety and survival and an in-house engineer academy for five of the departments more senior volunteers.
- Dan continues to work on his Probationary Training.
- Jeff Smith is teaching an in-house Engineer Academy to our more senior volunteers.
- Dan Rotwein and David Purcell are working on their in house engineer certification.

MAINTENANCE

- All 4 department vehicles underwent a comprehensive monthly check during August.
- All gas-powered equipment was checked weekly during the month.
- All vehicle batteries were serviced and charged on a weekly basis during the month.
- In August, an EIR was completed with help from MCFD for the repairs on the Queenstone Fire Road.

Succession Planning for implementation of Paramedic Positions

The department currently has two paramedics, one on A shift (Dan Rotwein) and one on C Shift (Sean Day). There is one immediate opening (Joel White's retirement) and one long term opening, possibly turning to a full time opening depending on what happens with his disability (Captain Steve Heine). I have hired Volunteer David Purcell as a Temp Firefighter to temporarily help fill the gap. Dan has hours available through late October. The department has an eligibility list of Firefighter Paramedics. When the next new hire academy happens Marinwood will have one new hire, possibly two depending on what happens with Captain Heine's injury. San Rafael is not having a new hire academy until early fall at the soonest.

Cert

I am currently working with CERT Leaders from Mont Marin, LVHA, and Marinwood for a joint drill to happen on October 14. Multiple planning meetings have occurred in preparation for the drill.

The trailer is complete and is an available resource to the Marinwood CERT Team or others in and around the County should they need it.

Wildland Season and Vegetation Management Projects

Wildland Season is upon California and Marin. The department's type 3 is currently at a fire in Sequoia National Forest with a San Rafael Fire Captain, and a Marinwood Engineer and Firefighter. I have a proposal from MCFD Fuels crew to do a vegetation management project along the Queenstone Fire Road in preparation for future grading to smooth the fire road out and prevent erosion. The crew plans to begin the work next week.

Kitchen Remodel

The Board of Directors decided at a Special Board meeting on Thursday August 31 to issue the kitchen RFP and accept sealed bids at a date in September to be considered during the October Board meeting.

Succession Planning for the Marinwood Fire Department

**MARINWOOD COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT
MEMORIAL AND RECOGNITION POLICY – DRAFT**

Presented to the Fire Commission: September 5, 2017

Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is:

- To provide for the placement on District property of memorials and recognitions, including the formal dedication and naming of District property, in recognition of individuals, organizations, or businesses.
- The provision of consistencies in type, placement, installation and size of recognitions and memorials and the protection of all District facilities for the benefit of all citizens

Definitions:

- A memorial or recognition is a monument, plaque, or written statement that serves to remember or recognize an individual, organization, business or event.
- A plaque is a flat slab, or disk engraved or ornamented for mounting.
- A monument is a structure, sculpture, inscribed stone, or marker.

Policy and Procedure:

1. Memorials and recognitions requested to be installed, constructed or placed on District property, including the formal dedication and naming of a District park, open space, facility or a portion therein, must be approved by majority vote of the Board of Directors.
2. Public requests for memorials and recognitions to be installed, constructed or placed within District property shall be made in writing to the respective District Commission c/o the District Manager. Requesting parties shall include the preferred type of material and design for the memorial or recognition. The request will be considered for recommendation to the Board of Directors at a future meeting of the respective Commission.
 - a. Requests for memorials or recognitions to be placed within District parks, open space or recreation facilities shall be submitted to the Park & Recreation Commission c/o the District Manager.
 - b. Requests for memorials and recognitions to be placed within or near the immediate proximity of the Marinwood Fire Department shall submitted to the Fire Commission c/o the District Manager.

3. Upon review, all public requests for memorials and recognitions shall be submitted by the respective Commission to the Board of Directors for final approval or denial of request. Submission will include a written statement from the respective Commission Chair regarding whether, by formal vote of the Commission, the request is “recommended for approval” or “not recommended for approval.”
4. Memorials and recognitions must recognize a current or former District resident, volunteer or employee or be for an organization or business who has made a substantial contribution to the purchase, improvement, programming, operations or department at the location in which the recognition is requested to appear.
5. Monuments and plaques must be affixed to a park bench, bolder, entry kiosk or other appropriate fixture.
6. The size of monuments or memorials shall be scaled to the fixture and appropriate to the environment of the facility or area in which it is placed. Appropriate materials shall be bronze, stone, or other durable material.
 - a. Bench plaques shall be no larger than 6”x 8”.
 - b. Markers shall be no larger than 11”x 14”.
 - c. Other monuments shall be no larger than 18”x 20”.
7. The cost of all materials, including fixture, installation and replacement will be borne by the requesting party.
8. The Recreation Director, Fire Chief or their designee will determine the optimum location for memorials and recognitions within their respective District area.
9. District staff, commissioners and directors may initiate requests for memorials and recognitions, following the approval process set forth in this policy.
10. Donations for plant material and landscape improvements will be recognized by a proclamation drafted by the Board of Directors and posted on the Marinwood website.
