POLICIES/DISTRICT INFORMATION

GOVERNANCE

The Marinwood Community Services District (CSD) was formed in 1960 to provide street lighting, fire protection and park and recreation services for our area. The CSD is governed by an elected five-member Board of Directors. The Board has established two advisory Commissions (Fire and Parks and Recreation) to oversee the routine operations of the District and to make recommendations regarding policies and budgetary matters. The District Manager and Department Heads carry out the day-to-day functions of the District as directed by the Board. The Board and Commission agendas can be found at www.marinwood.org. The Marinwood Review provides information on community meetings, events, programs, and other information of interest to the Community. Comments or suggestions regarding the publication should be directed to csd@marinwood.org.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors is a 5-member governing body of the Marinwood Community Services District (MCSD) and acts collectively to establish policies, provide oversight, and set vision to ensure the District offers the highest level of service in a fiscally sustainable way.

The Board of Directors has authority to establish or modify ordinances, resolutions and policies guiding the governance and operation of MCSD within its geographical boundaries and sphere of influence, including Joint Powers and Shared Services Agreements. The Board of Directors provides direction to and receives recommendations from the District Manager, the Fire Commission and the Park & Recreation Commission. The primary responsibility of the Board of Directors is the formulation and evaluation of policy. Routine matters concerning the operational aspects of the District are to be delegated to professional staff members of the District.

A Salute to Our "Firstest Responders"

Running an outdoor summer camp that serves over 500 kids a day comes with its share of minor injuries. Bumps, bruises, and bee stings. Cuts, scrapes, and bloody noses. Splinters, lost teeth, and stubbed toes. On any given day it's not unusual to see a camper in the lobby or down at the pool desk receiving an ice pack, band-aid, or sting-relief-swab. And while it's always heartbreaking to see one of our campers in distress, watching our camp staff give them the care they need can be heartwarming, too.

Just as some unlucky summer campers become minor First Aid patients, so also do our summer camp counselors and lifeguards become temporary medics, springing into action when injuries strike. It can be an abrupt shift—one minute they are casually demonstrating how to make a friendship bracelet, the next they are delicately removing a bee stinger



from a crying child's toe, simultaneously trying to keep the child calm and comforted while watching for signs of allergic reaction.

These situations demand professionalism, selflessness, and the execution of multifaceted skills, and tend to reveal the true mettle of a staff member. One can't help feeling proud and inspired watching a typically goofy teenager suddenly rise to the occasion and snap into "First Responder Mode." And at times like these, First Responders are just what our summer camp counselors and lifequards are.

Now sometimes bigger injuries occur at summer camp that necessitate bringing out the more professional, full-time First Responders, like firefighters, EMTs, and paramedics. In these instances, our camp staff will provide whatever First Aid care they can until the professionals arrive, at which point they gratefully hand off the First Aid baton. In this way our summer camp staff could be considered sort of "Pre-First Responders" or "Firstest Responders," on the scene before anyone else. (Those terms haven't entirely caught on in the industry yet, but I'm working on it.)

My own 3 boys had their share of bumps and bruises at camp this summer. (My 5-year-old's broken arm happened at home, but I know he would have received stellar care if it had been at camp!) Their scads of band-aids, scabs, and scars



still polka dotting their arms and legs are not just badges of honor from an active and adventurous summer, but also reminders of all the nurturing and professional First Aid care they received from their incredible summer camp staff—the "Firstest Responders," dutifully snapping into action.

And then resuming the dodgeball game.

THREES TOGETHER

Ages 3-4

Our Threes Together class is a stimulating program that meets the developmental needs for three and four year olds. With small class sizes and a low student teacher ratio, we offer nurturing interactions, thoughtful and creative activities, and intentional support to our children as they begin their preschool experience. Each day, children will explore play materials that stimulate their imaginations, engage in art, play outside, and gather for circle time which includes puppetry, storytelling, and music.






