

"Just the Lifeguard"

"So, where do you work when the pool closes?" I get asked this question at least a few times each season when I fill in at the pool for a sick lifeguard or help cover a shift that is difficult to staff. The question, often from a kindly lap swimmer, assumes I am one of Marinwood's part-time lifeguards who will be out of work when the season ends. I used to find this question a little embarrassing and I would sheepishly explain my position and why I was stuck having to lifeguard. But I have since grown to welcome the question and to embrace my continued role as a sometime-member of the Marinwood lifeguard staff (not to mention the flattering—if farfetched—possibility I am passing for "lifeguard age").

It has now become a running joke in the office that whenever someone asks me to make a "director-level decision" or take a phone call from someone who wants "to speak to the manager," I wink and say, "oh I'm just the lifeguard!"

But I am only the latest in a long legacy of "just-the-lifeguards" occupying various full-time positions with Marinwood. Besides the Recreation staff all holding lifeguard certificates and filling in as needed (something Marinwood has always prioritized), over the years anyone from maintenance workers to administrative staff to even the District Manager himself have been seen taking shifts on the lifeguard stand when staffing was tough. This unorthodox, by-any-means-necessary approach to staffing the pool has not only allowed us to stay open when neighboring pools have had to close, it exemplifies two things I have come to greatly appreciate about Marinwood: no one wears just one hat, and no job or task is "below one's paygrade."


On a given day one of the recreation staff might be found substitute teaching in the preschool, pulling weeds around the community center, checking lap swimmers in at the pool, unclogging toilets in the bathroom, teaching a CPR class, constructing a piano cart, and any number of other diverse tasks. Similarly, on a given day one of Marinwood's maintenance workers might be found mopping the community center, adjusting the pool chemistry, planting flowers, fixing an irrigation leak, removing abandoned shopping carts from the creek, aerating the lawn, etc. As a small district with a small staff, everyone must (and gets to) perform a multitude of tasks. And that's part of what makes this place such an exciting and dynamic place to work.

Marinwood's longtime Parks Maintenance Director Gary Harrelson loved to tell a story about a disagreement he once had with a resident who, before storming off, yelled, "What do you know, you're just the gardener!" Gary found the epithet amusing and adopted it as a sort of badge of honor, even titling his long-running column in these pages Just the Gardener. While Gary no doubt would have preferred more staff to help get the job done, I know he enjoyed his opportunities to seem like "just the gardener"—working out in the field alongside his crew, visiting with residents as they walked their dogs through the park, and feeling at once connected to the community he worked for, to the staff he managed, and to the grounds he oversaw.

Like Gary before me, I am proud to be mistaken for "just the lifeguard." It's a reminder that I am part of the tradition of Marinwood's "just-the-gardeners," "just-the-lifeguards," "just-the-camp-counselors," etc. that have had the privilege of getting out of the office, filling in as needed, and staying intricately connected to staff, the patrons, and the grounds that make our programs possible.

Can I drop in for a day of camp?

What is your refund policy? How do I make camp changes?

All refund and change requests must be made in writing and can be emailed to csd@marinwood.org. We will not process refunds or changes over the phone. Cancellations made more than 6 business days prior to the beginning of the camp session will result in a \$35 per session per camper fee (see chart below). Cancellations made less than 6 business days prior to the beginning of the camp session will result in the forfeiture of half the camp session fee per camper. No refunds will be granted if received after 5:00pm the Friday before the session begins.

Where and when can I pick up my camper's t-shirts?

Summer Camp FAQ

How does swimming at camp work?

Parents must give permission for their camper to swim in the Marinwood Pool. Camps Pine Cone and Miwok swim only in the tot pool. Camps Willow, Buckeye, Bumblebee, and Acorn have the option of tot or main pool. All other camps use the main pool. Campers must pass a swim test (uninterrupted swim of 25 yards) to be able to swim in the deep end. Campers may be asked to retake the swim test for camp, even if they have previously passed outside of camp. Please note: The water slides will be closed for the 2021 swim season.

Can I order lunch for my child?

Yes. Marinwood CSD has partnered with BOONLI to provide online lunch ordering. All lunches are provided by our local Marinwood Market. Lunch options include a hot entrée or market sandwich, 2 organic sides and a drink. You can choose how many days a week you want lunch provided. Orders must be submitted by 10:00am the Friday before the session begins. No late orders will be accepted. Please pack a morning snack, as lunch will not arrive until noon. Lunch ordering will open in late spring, link will be provided on our website.

What if my child has a food allergy?

Our number one priority is the safety of your child. Camp staff take precautions and preventative measures to ensure the safety of all campers. We practice a no share snack and lunch policy, where we talk with our campers about keeping our food to ourselves, educate our staff about monitoring during snack and lunch time and campers will wash hands after meals.

Please indicate any allergies or medical conditions on your camper's ePACT online form so we can be aware of how to best support and provide for your child.

Don't forget about Hog Dog Fridays!

Take the hassle out of making lunch at the end of the week with Marinwood's \$5 Hot Dog Meal. Marinwood will be grilling up all natural, nitrate free hot dogs on the barbecue every Friday. Hot Dog Meals include a hot dog, organic juice, and all natural chips. A vegetarian hot dog option is also available. To purchase, please bring exact change and give to the Camp Director on Friday morning. Don't forget to send snack with your camper on Fridays. We will be offering Friday Hot Dog Days all summer.

Can my camper attend a Marinwood camp after the specialty camp ends?

Yes, this is an option for specialty camps that run from 9:00-12:00pm and if the Marinwood day camp has space or you are already enrolled in a Marinwood camp. The camper may attend Marinwood's camp from 12:00-3:00pm for the week of the specialty camp for a prorated amount. Camp staff will escort the camper at the end of the specialty camp to Marinwood's camp at noon.

Campers must be enrolled in both a day camp and specialty camp first, then email csd@marinwood.org for the prorated refund. The half day Marinwood camp fee will be \$410 for residents and \$480 for non-residents for the two-week session.

COVID Responsibilities and Procedures

Camp parents/guardians are responsible for notifying Marinwood about illnesses, possible exposures and any positive COVID-19 test results as soon as possible during the camp season. While Marinwood will take all possible precautions to protect the health and safety of campers and staff, we expect everyone to follow the current health and safety guidelines.

Possible Scenarios:

- If your camper or someone in your household either exhibits COVID-19 symptoms or has a temperature of 100.4 degrees or above, the camper should not come to camp and your healthcare provider should be contacted for possible recommended testing. The cohort will remain open. If a test is recommended and the test results are negative, the camper may return to camp 24 hours after symptoms resolve.
- If a family member or someone in close contact with a camper or staff member tests positive for COVID-19 then immediately report the possible exposure to the Marinwood front office. The camper will need to quarantine for 10 days (even if the camper receives a negative COVID-19 test result), monitor for symptoms, and contact their healthcare provider. The cohort will be notified but remain open. Once Marinwood is notified of the test results, the cohort will once again be notified. Campers and staff should monitor themselves for symptoms.
- If a camper or staff member test positive for COVID-19, then immediately report this to the Marinwood front office. The cohort will remain closed for 10 days from last known exposure and everyone should quarantine to greatest extent possible. The campers and staff of the cohort should get tested for potential exposure.

Please note: if any camper is required to quarantine for any of the above reasons, all other household members who attend our summer camp program will need to quarantine as well.



Marinwood Swim Academy Private Lessons FAQ

Will group lessons take place this summer?

Unfortunately, no. We are only able to offer private and semi-private lessons this summer.

Can my child take a swim lesson while they are at camp or after care?

Campers can be enrolled in a private swim lesson; however, we will not be able to provide staff to transport swimmers from Camp or After Care to their swim lesson. A parent/quardian must be present to walk campers to and from their lessons.

Will my swimmer need to wear a face covering or face shield in the water?

No. The current health guidelines caution that wearing face coverings/shields while swimming presents safety risks. However, we ask that all swimmers wear a cloth face covering any time while not in the pool.

How many children can participate in a semi-private swim lesson?

We allow a maximum of two children from the same household in semi-private lessons. Children should have a similar ability level.

Can I sign up my swimmer and their best friend to do a semi-private swim lesson together if they are in the same social bubble? Unfortunately, children in semi-private lessons must be from the same household.

Can I request a specific instructor for my swimmer?

Yes. While we cannot guarantee any requests, we do our best to accommodate requests when we can. If you wish to request an instructor, please include your request in the "customer notes" when you register online.

What does my child need to bring to swim lessons?

Your child should come to swim lessons in a swimsuit (and swim shirt if desired) and bring a towel. Goggles are recommended but not required. Please tie back long hair.

Are you offering a pool membership this season?

No. Due to the uncertainties surrounding COVID-19 and the evolving health guidelines, we are not offering a pool membership option this season.

I need to enroll my swimmer in lessons, but I am facing financial hardship. Is there anything that I can do?

We understand that swim lessons are essential. If you are facing financial hardship, please apply for the Danaz Salak Swim Lesson Scholarship which can be found on our website www.marinwood.org.

Other Safety Protocols:

- One person per lane with 1 exception: members of the same household may share a lane if desired (up to 2 household members per lane; must be processed over the phone; normal pricing applies).
- In-water time is limited to 50 minutes so staff can disinfect the facility between reservations.
- Face coverings are required, except when swimming.

Reservation cost covers up to 4 people. For groups of 5 or 6, additional members can be added to the reservation on the day of for an additional cost (see below). Groups with more than 6 members will need to purchase 2 separate reservations in advance.

Marinwood Resident: \$32 (up to 4 people); \$8 per additional person (up to 2), paid upon arrival Non-Residents: \$40 (up to 4 people); \$10 per additional person (up to 2), paid upon arrival

How to make a reservation:

Reservations must be made in advance. No walk-up reservations will be accepted at the pool. Reservations for a given month will become available to purchase at 9:00am the first Monday of the month prior for Marinwood Residents, and the first Tuesday of the month prior for non-residents. Please note: please only make one reservation per group of 4-6 members; and only one member of a group needs to be listed on the reservation. Reservations must be purchased online at www.marinwood.org. Click on "Register for Activities" and then search for "Recreation Swim" in the search box. Available reservations may be added to your cart.

Check-in:

Please check in at the pool front desk at the start of your reservation, at which time you and the members of your group will sign in and be asked COVID-19 screening questions. At this time groups of 5 or 6 will be prompted to pay for their additional household members

Face coverings must be worn at all times except when in the water. Bathroom facilities and showers are available for one group at a time. We recommend changing into swimwear prior to arrival at the facility.

Check-out:

Patrons must be cleaned up and ready to exit the facility at the end of the reservation time. This will allow for sufficient cleaning of the facility before the next group arrives at the pool. Face coverings are required as soon as swimmers exit the water.

Other Safety Protocols:

- Social distancing is required; patrons must monitor themselves in the facility (as well as inside the pool).
- Lifejackets can be reserved during your reservation and will be disinfected between use. However, patrons are encouraged to bring their own US Coast Guard approved lifejackets if needed.
- No pool toys will be permitted

Marinwood Pool - Tot Pool Swim Reservations

Beginning April 12th, the Marinwood Tot Pool (for ages 6 and under) will be open for reservations 7 days a week. Reservations are available in two-hour blocks for groups of up to 6 people. 


