PAYMENT

Payment must be received at the time of registration along with a registration form. We gladly accept Visa, Mastercard, American Express, Discover, cash, or check (made out to MCSD).

Upon receipt of your registration form and payment, you will be registered for the class unless notified that a class is full or cancelled, in which case a full refund will be granted.

Please note: Marinwood CSD only allows one payer per receipt.

CLASSES AND CAMPS REFUND AND TRANSFER POLICY:

Minimum cancellation fee: \$10.00. (Cancellation fee may vary, check registration activity on website for details). All refunds and changes must be made in writing and can be emailed to

csd@marinwood.org. We will not process refunds or changes over the phone. Marinwood CSD reserves the right to cancel any class/activity that does not meet minimum enrollment. Please register early to avoid class cancellations. If a class is cancelled, you will receive a full refund.

CLASSES:

Refunds are class specific, please see activity details for policy.

SUMMER CAMPS:

All refund and change requests must be made in writing and can be emailed to csd@marinwood.org. We will not process refunds or changes over the phone. Cancellations made more than 6 business days (10 full days) prior to the beginning of the camp session will result in a \$35 per session per camper fee. Cancellations made less than 6 business days prior to the beginning of the camp session will result in the forfeiture of half the camp session fee per camper. No refunds will be granted after 5:00pm the Friday before the camp session begins. All camp change requests must be made in writing and are subject to a \$10 handling fee. Marinwood does not prorate camp sessions.

Policies/District Information

GOVERNANCE

The Marinwood Community Services District (CSD) was formed in 1960 to provide street lighting, fire protection and park and recreation services for our area. The CSD is governed by an elected five-member Board of Directors. The Board has established two advisory Commissions (Fire and Parks and Recreation) to oversee the routine operations of the District and to make recommendations regarding policies and budgetary matters. The District Manager and Department Heads carry out the day-to-day functions of the District as directed by the Board. The Board and Commission agendas can be found at www.marinwood.org. The Marinwood Review provides information on community meetings, events, programs, and other information of interest to the Community. Comments or suggestions regarding the publication should be directed to csd@marinwood.org.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors is a 5-member governing body of the Marinwood Community Services District (MCSD) and acts collectively to establish policies, provide oversight, and set vision to ensure the District offers the highest level of service in a fiscally sustainable way.

The Board of Directors has authority to establish or modify ordinances, resolutions and policies guiding the governance and operation of MCSD within its geographical boundaries and sphere of influence, including Joint Powers and Shared Services Agreements. The Board of Directors provides direction to and receives recommendations from the District Manager, the Fire Commission and the Park & Recreation Commission. The primary responsibility of the Board of Directors is the formulation and evaluation of policy. Routine matters concerning the operational aspects of the District are to be delegated to professional staff members of the District.

Free Defensible Space Direct Assistance

Need help preparing your property for the 2024 wildfire season?

Why?

- Highly combustible plants like Juniper and Italian Cypress can't be maintained in a way that makes them fire resistant.
- Oils within the plants and the buildup of dead material behind their deceptively green foliage is dangerous year-round.
- Removing highly combustible vegetation within 30 feet of a structure and 10 feet of roadways will help improve defensible space and create safer evacuation routes.

How?

The City works with the FIRE Foundry crew and wildfire mitigation contractors to remove fire hazardous plants like Juniper and Italian Cypress at no cost to Marinwood and San Rafael property owners.

Completing a waiver form does not guarantee that you will receive assistance.

What are some things you enjoy about working at Marinwood?

Guy: "I like keeping the place clean and creating a nice environment for the kids. Oh, and don't forget free access to the pool! The lifeguards know us and know that we are good swimmers. They know that we can swim in the deep end." Guy and JP regularly go swimming together at the Marinwood Pool after work, sometimes for multiple hours. "I also enjoy seeing all the crows make a ruckus in the park. And making money, of course! But I don't do it just for the money."

JP: "I like keeping the environment and the earth clean and making it nice for families and kids to come here. I also enjoy getting to swim at the pool after work."

What do you like to do in your free time?

Guy: "I enjoy going on long walks, playing games on my computer, and swimming. I really like swimming at different beaches, rivers, and lakes around the Bay Area. Recently while I was standing in the waves at Stinson an 8-foot wave crashed over me!" Guy also enjoys going on weekend trips to see his friend Evy on her farm in Petaluma. Before the pandemic Guy, a self-described "public transportation master," frequently went on long solo trips around the bay area on public transportation, sometimes making it as far as Sacramento and back, often having to navigate multiple connections and modes of transportation.






PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

THREES TOGETHER

Ages 3-4

MARINWOOD REVIEW COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT

Featuring Les Mize, longtime Marinwood resident and founding member of the Las Gallinas Lions Club.

Following a recent Lions Club meeting it was overheard that one of the Lions members holds a 58-year perfect attendance record at Lions Club meetings. We decided to catch up with this dedicated Lion to find out more about his history and involvement with the Lions. We are pleased to introduce longtime Marinwood resident, Las Gallinas Lions Club founder, and dear friend of the recreation department, Les Mize.

Les, how did you get your start in community service?

When I was a student at Tamalpais High School, the city of Mill Valley was looking into building a community youth center. To help raise funds for the center, among other fundraising efforts, I started Friday night teen dances at the Mill Valley Golf Clubhouse and formed the Mill Valley Youth Council.

And when did you become a Lion?

Around that time, I began volunteering with the Mill Valley Lions Club on weekends as they undertook the remodeling of the Ranch Wagon Restaurant which had been closed down. The restaurant, which the Lions later gifted to the city of Milly Valley for \$1.00, was relocated and turned into a multifunctional building with the volunteer help of local architects who worked with the Mill Valley Planning Department. Through this project I got to know many Lions members and eventually asked to join the club. As I was only 18, the club had to call Lions International in Chicago to check the age requirements. Having no age restrictions, I was allowed to apply and joined on March 1, 1965.

Over the next 15 years as a Mill Valley Lion I got married (1969), moved to Marinwood (1970), and started a family (1972), which now includes 6 children and 8 grandchildren, all the while attending Lions meetings every Tuesday night. In 1980 I spearheaded the effort to start our local chapter, the Las Gallinas Lions Club, where I have served ever since.

What are some highlights from your years as a Lion?

Some of my proudest moments during my time as a Lion include being elected district governor of our Northwest California District (55 clubs) from 2017-2018, starting the Las Gallinas club in 1980, and achieving perfect attendance during my 58 years (and counting) as a Lion.

What is on the horizon for the Las Gallinas Lions Club?

The Las Gallinas Lions Club continues to be involved with many projects and activities throughout the Marinwood community such as our annual Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween parades and costume contests, vision programs, working as needed with the Parks and Recreation with their various activities, community weed whacking cleanup, beautification projects such as bulb planting, and more as we continue "keeping Marinwood the best community around."

SUMMER CAMP FAQ

How do I register my child for camp?

There are three ways to register:

- -Online registration at www.marinwood.org. (Recommended—typically the fastest registration method)
- -Register in person at the Community Center
- -Mail, fax or email a registration form (complete with full payment).

What if the camp I want is full?

If a desired camp session is full, you will see an option to add your child to the waiting list (at no cost). We will contact you if a spot becomes available and you will have until 10:00am the next business day to claim your spot. If we don't hear from you in time, we will remove you from the waitlist and contact the next person.

To expedite the waitlist process, in early May we will purge the waitlist of all those no longer interested. We will email you at that time asking you to confirm your continued interest in remaining on the waitlist. Anyone who asks to be removed or fails to respond will be removed and everyone else will move up, respectively.

On June 5th the waitlist will be discontinued altogether and any camp openings thereafter can be registered for online on a first come, first served basis. Anyone looking for camp spots after June 5th will be able to browse the registration site for available camp sessions.

Can I drop in for a day of camp?

No, Marinwood will not be accepting drop-in registrations. Campers must be registered for the full session.

What is your refund policy? How do I make camp changes?

All refund and change requests must be made in writing and can be emailed to csd@marinwood.org. We will not process refunds or changes over the phone. Cancellations made more than 6 business days (10 full days) prior to the beginning of the camp session will result in a \$35 per session per camper fee. Cancellations made less than 6 business days prior to the beginning of the camp session will result in the forfeiture of half the camp session fee per camper. No refunds will be granted after 5:00pm the Friday before the camp session begins. All camp change requests must be made in writing and are subject to a \$10 handling fee. Marinwood does not prorate camp sessions.

If my child is enrolled in a half-day specialty camp, can they join a day camp for the second half of the day?

Yes, this is an option for specialty camps located at Miller Creek Middle School that run from 9:00-12:00pm and if the Marinwood day camp has space or you are already enrolled in a Marinwood camp. The camper may attend Marinwood's camp from 12:00-3:00pm for the week of the specialty camp for a prorated amount. Camp staff will escort the camper to Marinwood's camp at noon. Campers must be enrolled in both Marinwood's camp and the specialty camp first, then email csd@marinwood.org for the prorated refund. The half day Marinwood camp fee will be \$196 for residents and \$222 for non-residents for the session.

Where and when can I pick up my camper's t-shirts?

Camp shirts will be available for pickup starting in May at the Community Center during business hours (Monday-Friday, 9am-5pm). For safety, campers are required to wear a Marinwood camp t-shirt daily. Campers will receive 2 shirts per summer with the option of purchasing additional camp shirts for \$10. Pick up camp shirts at the Marinwood Community Center. Marinwood highly recommends picking up camp shirts before the first day of camp.

SUMMER CAMP FAQ

What should my camper bring with them every day?

Campers should come wearing appropriate camp attire. A Marinwood camp shirt and closed toe shoes are mandatory. Campers should bring a labeled backpack containing a snack, lunch, water bottle, swimsuit, towel, and sunscreen. Please try and limit camper's belongings to one backpack/baq. Younger campers should bring an extra set of clothes.

Are there any other requirements for campers to attend?

All campers must be potty trained. Parents/guardians will be required to fill out an online camper information and consent form from the ePACT network before attending. All participants (3rd grade and younger) must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at check-in each day at the community center. Campers are not allowed to attend if ill.

How does check-in and check-out work?

All participants (3rd grade and younger) must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at check-in each day at the community center. Campers are not allowed to attend if ill. For more information, please read the Camp Parent Packet.

Check-in:

Campers must be checked in with their Camp Director. Check-in will take place from 9:00-9:20am.

*Campers may be checked in after this time but it is a parent's responsibility to locate the camp to drop them off.

Check-out:

Campers must be checked out with camp staff before leaving. Checkout will take place from 2:50-3:05pm. If your camper is not picked up by 3:05pm, they will be sent to After Care and you will be charged a late drop-in After Care fee of \$25.

Do you offer Before and/or After Care?

Yes, Before Care runs from 8:00-9:00am and After Care from 3:00-5:00pm for additional fees. Please see our Before and After Care page for more information.

Can my child take swim lessons during the camp day?

Yes, you may enroll in group or private lessons during the camp day for an additional fee. Camp staff will escort campers to lessons that take place between 10:45am and 2:25pm. Parents are responsible for escorting campers to any swim lessons scheduled at 2:30pm or 3:00pm — no exceptions. Please visit swim lesson page for additional information.

How does swimming work at camp?

Parents must give permission for their camper to swim in the Marinwood main and tot pools. Camps Pine Cone and Miwok swim only in the tot pool. Camps Willow, Buckeye, Bumblebee, and Acorn have the option of tot pool or main pool. All other camps exclusively use the main pool. Campers must pass a swim test (uninterrupted swim of 25 yards) to be able to swim in the deep end and go down the water slides. Campers may be asked to retake the swim test for camp, even if they have previously passed in another setting.

Can I order lunch for my child?

Yes. Marinwood CSD has partnered with BOONLI to provide online lunch ordering. All lunches are provided by our local Marinwood Market. You can choose how many days a week you want lunch provided. *Orders must be submitted by 10:00am the Friday before the session begins*. Online ordering will be available closer to summer through the Marinwood website. No late orders will be accepted. Please pack a morning snack, as lunch will not arrive until noon.

What if my child has a food allergy?

Our number one priority is the safety of your child. Camp staff take precautions and preventative measures to ensure the safety of all campers. We practice a no share snack and lunch policy, where we talk with our campers about keeping our food to ourselves, educate our staff about monitoring during snack and lunch time and campers will wash hands after meals.

Please indicate any allergies or medical conditions on your camper's ePACT online form so we can be aware of how to best support and provide for your child.

Don't forget about Hot Dog Fridays!

Take the hassle out of making lunch at the end of the week with Marinwood's \$6 Hot Dog Meal. Marinwood will be grilling up all natural, nitrate free hot dogs on the barbecue every Friday. Hot Dog Meals include a hot dog, organic juice, and all-natural chips. A vegetarian hot dog or gluten free bun option is also available. To purchase, please bring exact change and give to the Camp Director on Friday morning. Don't forget to send snack with your camper on Fridays. We will be offering Friday Hot Dog Days all summer (except July 5).


Session 1 (June 17-June 21) Summer Blast Off

 - 3. Tread water with legs only (2 minutes).


